Peripatetic lessons started for students who have a passion for music, whilst we concentrated on getting music and performance back up and running at Grace.

If that wasn't enough excitement we also had our best attended Year 6 open evening with over 400 people coming to see our fantastic school. After all of this, we raised £300 for Macmillan coffee morning and got busy baking to ensure we were giving back to the community.





OCTOBER

We had lots of events during this term including: Sixth Form open evening, Year 7 Meet the Tutor evening, workshops from the Grace Foundation on County Lines and Black History Month and careers talks from IM Group Ltd.

We supported the transition for both Year 7 and Year II with evening events that encouraged Intentional Excellence and discussed our students' Limitless Potential. We also arranged for Sixth Form to visit Lincoln university and the Crown court. We gratefully received support from our local Sikh temple who provide Langar Aid, donating fresh vegetables and food to the Academy to be shared with our families, which helped our school community to understand what Mutual Respect can look like in life outside of school. Our new sports team kits, sponsored by Fiera Real Estate, were proudly worn for the first time of the season and definitely have contributed to the increasingly impressive results as we became the team to watch out for – especially our girls' football team

We were enormously proud of our Harvest contribution this year - especially from Year 7, where one student donated 65 cans of fruit and vegetables by himself! We were also visited by the IM Group and the Grace Foundation to talk about life beyond the classroom to further inspire our young people. Our students were really engaged in both sessions on Black History month and the dangers of County Lines - it is so important





We came together as a whole community this month with: Sixth Form mentoring, healthy relationships workshops, Remembrance and Diwali and saw our Year 7 football team build upon their winning streak.

This term we celebrated significant cultural events such as Diwali; Miss Kaur used the festival of light to bring more colour into the main street in school - sharing what the festival means in religious terms but also to different members of our community.

Equally, Mrs Leavy took charge of our Remembrance assemblies by bringing in items from her time in Military Service, enabling us to understand what life is really like for service men and women. Additionally, she also arranged for us all to hear "The Last Post" live in school when we gathered to stand in silence before every member of staff and student let their poppies rain down as a mark of respect.

We were all about Christmas festivities this term – it was contagious! We took 160 students to the Albany theatre to see a live performance of "A Christmas Carol", which was the first time our students had seen live acting on a professional stage! We had over 300 people attend our Christmas Fayre which helped everyone feel instantly festive, whether it was visiting Santa's grotto or riding the rodeo reindeer, every single person left with a gigantic smile. Similarly, our Hospitality and Catering students also spread seasonal joy by cooking a Christmas meal for members of our community, which was hosted by our Ethos team! To end the term we also delivered 78 Christmas hampers filled with goodies to families to help them enjoy the Christmas break, as we continuously focus on our families and how we can support them.





JANUARY

We started our new year with a bang!

This term we concentrated on the future with: Grace Foundation workshops on leadership, external facilitator sessions on Building Healthy Relationships, Year 7 experiencing Coventry University, Student Leaders meeting the Mayor and rewarding Year 11.
